## **1: EGPRN Pre-Conference Workshop on “Scoring Communication Skills”.**

(Morning 10.00 – 12.30 am)

Chairs: Kai Schnabel / Ulrich Woermann (Bern, Switzerland)

Different validated tools to assess conversational situations in a medical context are presented. The tools aim at assessing technical, verbal and nonverbal aspects of communication and allow a reliable and objective rating of skills in an adequate setting. Participants will apply the tools using examples like „communicating bad news“ and „education and consent“ and discuss their experiences. Possible fields of application in vocational as well as postgraduate training and continuing medical education will be discussed. Future cooperation may be facilitated and initiated.

Target group: colleagues interested in medical training and education and/or research in this field

## **2: EGPRN Pre-Conference Workshop on “How to use Simulated and Standardized Patients in your curriculum?”**

(Afternoon 13.00-17.00 pm)

Chairs: Jan-Joost Rethans (Maastricht, NL ) / Anne Simmenroth (Göttingen, Germany)

ASPE (Association of Standardized Patient Educators) is an international organization for professionals in the field of Simulated and Standardized Patient methodology that was developed in 2001. The mission of the Association and its members is to promote and support the development and advancement of Simulated/Standardized Patient (SP) education and research in the Health Sciences.

ASPE is pleased to partner with EGPRN for a 4 hour course on SP-methodology. Course givers will be Dr. Jan-Joost Rethans, director of SP- and Communication Skills programme at *the Maastricht Medical School (Skillslab, Maastricht University, The Netherlands)* and Dr. Anne Simmenroth-Nayda, *Fachärztin für Allgemeinmedizin, Dept. General Practice and Skillslab, Georg -August Universität Göttingen/Germany*. Both have wide (international) experience in working with SPs and faculty who work with SPs (SP-educators or similar positions)

### **Course level**

Course level will focus on those faculty who (wish to) work with SPs at beginner/intermediate level. Course givers will be as flexible as possible to make sure all participants will benefit equally.

### **Content/intended outcome of the course**

At the end of the course the participants will know about and/or have practiced:

- Which learning goals can be ‘taught’ with SPs
- Recruitment of SPs (who, how?)
- Difference between Simulated and Standardized patients.
- Developing script/case materials for SP roles for teaching
- Different SP training techniques.

This 4 hour course is designed for active learning-by-doing. Course methods will be a mixture of demonstration of techniques, short mini lectures, ‘do-it-yourself’ practice and small group work. Through the two days there is allotted time for discussions, feedback and exchange of

(international) experiences.

After subscribing for the course participants will be contacted by EGPRN to get an idea of the participants' level of expertise.

Course participants will be distributed a SP reader with useful references and main papers on SP-methodology and hand-out materials.

# **THE EGPRN SCIENTIFIC PROGRAMME**

## **THEME PAPERS**

At each meeting, time is allocated to papers on a specific theme. The theme is suggested by the country hosting the meeting and approved by the EGPRN Council. The current theme is 'Motivation'. Theme papers are allocated 30 minutes each, of which 15 minutes is for the presentation and 15 minutes for discussion.

## **FREE-STANDING PAPERS**

These are presentations not related to the theme. They are allocated 30 minutes each, of which 15 minutes is for the presentation and 15 minutes for discussion.

## **ONE SLIDE-FIVE MINUTES PRESENTATION**

One slide-five minutes presentations are for researchers who want to suggest an IDEA for research, raise a QUESTION concerning a research problem or want to invite others to participate in a planned study. This section is NOT for preliminary results. Five minutes is allocated for the presentation, using only one slide! Then there is five minutes for discussion.

## **POSTERS**

Posters are displayed throughout the Workshop. One session is allocated for discussion of the posters by the Workshop. The poster presenter is encouraged to attend the whole Workshop, but is required to be present for the poster discussion session. Postersize 1.75(h) x 1.00(w) m.

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACTS FOR THEME PAPERS, FREE-STANDING PAPERS, POSTERS AND ONE-SLIDE FIVE MINUTES PRESENTATIONS

## ABSTRACT

- **Use the following headings:**
  - Background, Research question(s), Methods, Results, Conclusion(s)
- **Describe:**
  - *Background*: what is the problem domain your study is relevant for? (what is already known, what knowledge is needed, and what new knowledge will be provided by your study) [suggestion: ± 50 words]
  - *Research question(s)*: write down the exact question(s) your study will give the answer to (if >3 objectives you will score less points on this criterion; we prefer focused research) [suggestion: ± 20 words]
  - *Methods*: mention at least study design, setting, participant selection, main variables measured (incl. reference standard in case of a diagnostic study or primary outcome measure in case of a cohort study or RCT) or qualitative methodology, analysis methods (quantitative, qualitative) and statistics (when appropriate) [suggestion: ± 100 words]
  - *Results*: present main results, on which the answer(s) to your research question(s) is/are based; confidence intervals are preferred above p-values. In case of a research proposal or ongoing study, describe expected or preliminary results [suggestion: ± 100 words]
  - *Conclusion(s)*: expressed as answer(s) to your research question(s) and based on your results [suggestion: ± 30 words]
  - In case of a *one-slide/five minutes presentation* we expect that you clearly describe background, (idea for) research question and proposed methodology
- **Max. 300 words**, provide a word count

## POINTS FOR DISCUSSION

- Write down 1-3 points you would like to discuss with your audience at the EGPRN meeting.
- These points will not influence the abstract selection process
- When your abstract is selected for presentation, these points will be added to the abstract book

## ABSTRACT SELECTION PROCESS

Four independent scorers will assess your abstract, according to the following 8 criteria:

- *Validity of the (proposed) study:*
  1. Is/Are the 'research question(s)' stated clearly? Max. 3? Clear focus?
  2. Is the applied methodology incl. design and setting appropriate to answer the research question(s)?
  3. Are the results consistent with the research question(s) and applied methodology?
  4. Are conclusion(s) based on results?
- *Relevance of the (proposed) study:*
  5. Does the (proposed) study add new knowledge to our knowledge base?
  6. Does the (proposed) study address a clinical topic?
  7. Are the (expected) results applicable in GP/FM/PC (practice, education, organisation)?
  8. Are there any special merits (e.g. original methodology, difficult research circumstances, junior researcher etc.)?

A maximum of 50 abstracts of apparent good quality will be accepted (max. 20 posters, max. 30 oral presentations). Research proposals as well research ideas (one-slide/five minutes) will be judged according to criteria 1, 2 and 5-8.

## EXAMPLE OF AN ABSTRACT

*Background:* In the western world peripheral arterial disease (PAD) is a major threat to the health of the elderly. Despite results of previous studies showing that the Ankle-Brachial Pressure Index (ABPI) is a meaningful indicator of the prognosis of patients with PAD, only 20-40% of the general practitioners centres in the Netherlands use the ABPI measurement.

*Research question:* Can ABPI measurements help in assessing the prognosis of subjects with and without PAD?

*Method:* The data set of the Limburg Peripheral Arterial Occlusive Disease Longitudinal Study (18 general practice centres, n=3649, mean age 59 years, mean follow-up time 7.2 years) was analysed for this purpose. Baseline and follow-up measurements included a self-administered questionnaire on signs and symptoms and a vascular physical examination. The ABPI was measured independently, using a handheld Doppler device. Outcome measures were progressive limb ischaemia, cardiovascular morbidity and (cardiovascular) mortality. Cox proportional hazard models were used to investigate the associations between ABPI categories and clinical outcome.

*Results:* Subjects with an ABPI between 0.90 and 1.00 were at higher risk to develop progressive limb ischaemia when compared to those with ABPI values  $\geq 1.00$ . Patients with a moderately reduced ABPI ( $0.70 < 0.90$ ) were at higher risk for the development of progressive limb ischaemia and non-fatal cardiovascular disease when compared to subjects with an ABPI  $\geq 0.90$ . Patients with an ABPI  $< 0.70$  not only developed non-fatal events more often but also were at highest risk to experience a fatal event.

*Conclusions:* Our results demonstrate that the lower the ABPI, the worse the prognosis with regard to fatal and non-fatal (cardio) vascular events. This knowledge of the ABPI can help the GP to assess prognosis in patients with PAD.
