Dear doctors, researchers, and colleagues,

On behalf of the host organizing committee, I would like to welcome all the faculty and participants of 73rd EGPRN-meeting. We are proud that this meeting takes place in Cracow - one of the most renowned historical, cultural, and spiritual cities of Poland.

The theme of our conference is: “Infectious Diseases in Primary Care; managing the interface between the person and the community”. We will have an opportunity to learn about common pathogens and medications, used to treat various types of infections. We need to understand the rationale behind antimicrobial therapy, the mechanism of action of different classes of antibiotics as well as multiple problems, associated with their use, ranging from adverse effects to drug resistance. Good medical knowledge and documentation are very important methods of reducing the risk of both medical errors and malpractice claims. In addition, clear communication with patients, their families, nursing staff and consulting physicians, represents a key strategy, which facilitates understanding of the clinical and emotional situation, and helps in proper decision making, leading to minimizing errors.**

We encourage all of you to active participation in this educational event, and to direct involvement in various workshops and presentations, during which you may ask questions and gain valuable “practice pearls”. Also, we would like to provide for you a lot of opportunities for networking and exchanging experiences with your peers and instructors. One of our objectives is to address several issues, related to both research and a daily family practice. Activities of this conference, such as formal lectures, workshops, presentations, and poster sessions will serve as vehicles of current knowledge. In addition, there will be plenty of time for informal sharing of the experiences relevant to individualized patient care, practice management, and research design. Together with our experts, you will discuss some strategies of how to deal with challenges and dangers of modern civilization, and how to successfully cooperate within multidisciplinary teams. 1: EGPRN Pre-Conference Workshop on “Focussing Research Questions”.

(Morning 10.00 – 12.30 am)

Thinking of a general theme in research is generally thrilling and exciting. But when it comes to state a focused research question, the general feeling might be resignation and frustration. A first step consists in reviewing the literature to make a survey of the state of knowledge in the research field and identify needs. The second step consists in stating a relevant, focused and feasible research question.

We expect attendees of this workshop to come with their research themes, having reviewed the literature in their field. They will have to present their preliminary work. Then the group will state the possible research questions, defining the main outcomes and the best possible method to answer the question. The duration of the workshop will be sufficient to examine 2 or 3 themes. The objective is to emphasize one's skills to define a precise research question.

Collaborative and translational research in general practice on respiratory tract infections
Background/Aims: EGPRN has been active in promoting collaborative research and in building up a research agenda for primary care, including challenging research on clinical diagnosis and prognosis, mixed methods research, translational research. In this workshop collaborative studies on the management of respiratory tract infections (RTI) in primary care are presented, including all those challenges.

Methods used in this workshop: We will present several examples of collaborative research on RTI management in primary care from GRACE (Genomics to combat Resistance against Antibiotics in Community-acquired LRTI in Europe; www.grace-lrti.org) and CHAMP (Changing behaviour of Health care professionals and the general public towards a More Prudent use of anti-microbial agents; www.champ-antibiotics.org). THE EGPRN SCIENTIFIC PROGRAMME

EGPRN welcomes the presentation of research relevant to general practice/family medicine. The Workshop welcomes research ideas, research in progress and completed research and aims to provide ample time for discussion of each presentation. There are four formats for presentation as detailed below.

THEME PAPERS

At each meeting, time is allocated to papers on a specific theme. The theme is suggested by the country hosting the meeting and approved by the EGPRN Council. The current theme is “Infectious Diseases in Primary Care; managing the interface between the person and the community”. Theme papers are allocated 30 minutes each, of which 15 minutes is for the presentation and 15 minutes for discussion.

FREE-STANDING PAPERS

These are presentations not related to the theme. They are allocated 30 minutes each, of which 15 minutes is for the presentation and 15 minutes for discussion.

ONE SLIDE-FIVE MINUTES PRESENTATION

One slide-five minutes presentations are for researchers who want to suggest an IDEA for research, raise a QUESTION concerning a research problem or want to invite others to participate in a planned study. This section is NOT for preliminary results. Five minutes is allocated for the presentation, using only one slide! Then there is five minutes for discussion.

SESSION FOR ‘RESEARCH IN PROGRESS’

This session is specifically defined for research dedicated to presentations without results - ‘research in progress’. If necessary EGPRN could offer mentorship.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACTS FOR THEME PAPERS, FREE-STANDING PAPERS, POSTERS AND ONE-SLIDE FIVE MINUTES PRESENTATIONS

ABSTRACT

- **Use the following headings:**
 - Background, Research question(s), Methods, Results, Conclusion(s)
- **Describe:**
 - *Background:* what is the problem domain your study is relevant for? (what is already known, what knowledge is needed, and what new knowledge will be provided by your study) [suggestion: \pm 50 words]
 - *Research question(s):* write down the exact question(s) your study will give the answer to (if >3 objectives you will score less points on this criterion; we prefer focused research) [suggestion: \pm 20 words]
 - *Methods:* mention at least study design, setting, participant selection, main variables measured (incl. reference standard in case of a diagnostic study or primary outcome measure in case of a cohort study or RCT) or qualitative methodology, analysis methods (quantitative, qualitative) and statistics (when appropriate) [suggestion: \pm 100 words]
 - *Results:* present main results, on which the answer(s) to your research question(s) is/are based; confidence intervals are preferred above p-values. In case of a research proposal or ongoing study, describe expected or preliminary results [suggestion: \pm 100 words]
 - *Conclusion(s):* expressed as answer(s) to your research question(s) and based on your results [suggestion: \pm 30 words]
 - In case of a *one-slide/five minutes presentation* we expect that you clearly describe background, (idea for) research question and proposed methodology
- **Max. 300 words**, provide a word count

POINTS FOR DISCUSSION

- Write down 1-3 points you would like to discuss with your audience at the EGPRN meeting.
- These points will not influence the abstract selection process
- When your abstract is selected for presentation, these points will be added to the abstract book

ABSTRACT SELECTION PROCESS

Four independent scorers will assess your abstract, according to the following 8 criteria:

- *Validity of the (proposed) study:*
 1. Is/Are the 'research question(s)' stated clearly? Max. 3? Clear focus?
 2. Is the applied methodology incl. design and setting appropriate to answer the research question(s)?
 3. Are the results consistent with the research question(s) and applied methodology?
 4. Are conclusion(s) based on results?
- *Relevance of the (proposed) study:*
 5. Does the (proposed) study add new knowledge to our knowledge base?
 6. Does the (proposed) study address a clinical topic?
 7. Are the (expected) results applicable in GP/FM/PC (practice, education, organisation)?
 8. Are there any special merits (e.g. original methodology, difficult research circumstances, junior researcher etc.)?

A maximum of 50 abstracts of apparent good quality will be accepted (max. 20 posters, max. 30 oral presentations). Research proposals as well research ideas (one-slide/five minutes) will be judged according to criteria 1, 2 and 5-8.

EXAMPLE OF AN ABSTRACT

Background: In the western world peripheral arterial disease (PAD) is a major threat to the health of the elderly. Despite results of previous studies showing that the Ankle-Brachial Pressure Index (ABPI) is a meaningful indicator of the prognosis of patients with PAD, only 20-40% of the general practitioners centres in the Netherlands use the ABPI measurement.

Research question: Can ABPI measurements help in assessing the prognosis of subjects with and without PAD?

Method: The data set of the Limburg Peripheral Arterial Occlusive Disease Longitudinal Study (18 general practice centres, n=3649, mean age 59 years, mean follow-up time 7.2 years) was analysed for this purpose. Baseline and follow-up measurements included a self-administered questionnaire on signs and symptoms and a vascular physical examination. The ABPI was measured independently, using a handheld Doppler device. Outcome measures were progressive limb ischaemia, cardiovascular morbidity and (cardiovascular) mortality. Cox proportional hazard models were used to investigate the associations between ABPI categories and clinical outcome.

Results: Subjects with an ABPI between 0.90 and 1.00 were at higher risk to develop progressive limb ischaemia when compared to those with ABPI values ≥ 1.00 . Patients with a moderately reduced ABPI ($0.70 < 0.90$) were at higher risk for the development of progressive limb ischaemia and non-fatal cardiovascular disease when compared to subjects with an ABPI ≥ 0.90 . Patients with an ABPI < 0.70 not only developed non-fatal events more often but also were at highest risk to experience a fatal event.

Conclusions: Our results demonstrate that the lower the ABPI, the worse the prognosis with regard to fatal and non-fatal (cardio) vascular events. This knowledge of the ABPI can help the GP to assess prognosis in patients with PAD.
